

### Thank you

All the staff wish to thank the parents and children for all the support since returning to school. Your assistance with using the different gates, timings and face coverings is much appreciated. We are continuing to review arrangements and will update you if we make any changes.

Please can we ask you to continue to arrive at the stated time for your child's drop-off and pick up and depart the site as soon as you have safely dropped off or collected your child. We do ask for only one adult to come at this point in the day please to reduce numbers as low as possible and to spread out in the designated areas. If you need to wait for siblings and have different timings please use available spaces to wait and avoid standing near the gates as this can cause heavy congestion on the footpaths.

### What to do if my child is ill

Please make sure you contact the school office on the morning of the first day of absence if your child is unable to attend school. It is important we know why any child is unable to attend. You can either leave a message on the school answerphone or speak to a member of office staff. We then ask you to update us on your child's circumstances in the following days.

For the foreseeable future we are not able to invite parents onsite to join us with activities so we are looking for alternative ways to share these with you.

We know that some of our children like to share a birthday treat with their class on their special day. In order to maintain our safety measures including limiting items being brought in from home we are not able to give these out to children or have them handed out via the children as they leave school at present so we ask that you do not to send these in to school. Thank you for your co-operation with this.

### Home learning

In the coming weeks we will be introducing the children and yourselves to our online learning platform. Staff are currently undertaking training and we will then be sharing this with yourselves. It is important we know your IT capacity at home so please make sure you have completed our IT at home capacity survey using this link:

In the event of having to learn from home again Microsoft Teams will be the platform that we will use to set work and communicate. Whilst this is being set up, if your child is well but needs to isolate due to family members or to await test results we will send home a sheet of suggested website and activities you can use to support them to learn at home. This will be sent home via email once you inform us of the reason your child is needed to isolate. Please contact the school if you require any support with this.

### Contact Details

Have you moved house or has your telephone number changed over the summer? It is important to make sure that we have the correct information should we need to contact you during the school day. If you have not received a text or email since we started back it may mean we do not have the correct details for you. **We do need two contacts as minimum for all children** so please ensure that you update these details via the school office or you can text to ensure that you continue to receive messages from the Havelock Schools.

### Headlice

We kindly ask all parents and carers to **please be vigilant and check your child's hair regularly for lice or nits (the eggs)**. Unfortunately head louse infection is a problem of the whole community, not just the schools. Anybody can get head lice, but it's more common in children.

Head lice are only transmitted by direct, still, prolonged head-to-head contact when the lice will walk from an infected person to another, once treated you need to treat again 1 week later. Please take some time over the weekend to check your child's hair.

The children are settling in really well and doing a great job of coming in on their own each morning. Please help us to help them by making sure jumpers are named and the children recognise their own possessions.

We will be sending the Y1 Phonics Packs home shortly.

These are for you to keep at home and can be used to help your child recap known sounds and practise new ones as they are taught in school.
