Our comprehensive risk assessment has also been reviewed and updated to reflect the latest DfE guidance and a copy of this can be found on our website in the policies section.

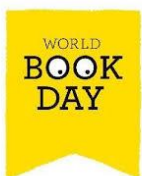

### Loaned Devices

If you were loaned a device during our remote learning period, please can you return this device on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March by sending it in with your child with the case and charger that it was loaned with. ### Lateral Flow Testing

Earlier this week we shared with you the information regarding lateral flow testing available for households with primary aged children. If you wish to take part, please follow the information contained in the link below on how to access testing kits. The lateral flows tests are only to be taken by the adults in the household. Primary aged children are not to take lateral flow tests twice weekly. This is for secondary aged children only.

### Symptoms and Reporting test results

It is really important that we all remain vigilant for spotting symptoms of COVID-19. If any member of your household displays a high temperature, persistent cough or loss of taste or smell please isolate as a household immediately and arrange to get a test. The household must remain isolated until the results are known. We ask that you inform us at school immediately if you are isolating as a household and then update us once the results are known. We will also be monitoring signs of symptoms at school and we will contact you immediately to collect any child that is displays any of the COVID-19 symptoms and ask that you arrange to have them tested.



If your child has a positive test result after 4pm or at the weekend please inform us by text on **07527324844**. It is important that you notify us as soon as possible so we can perform contact tracing for the 48 hours before symptoms started and inform close contacts to isolate.
